Gentlemen:

I am writing to express my strong support for the SKILLS Act presently before the U.S. House Committee on Education and the Workforce. The SKILLS Act is a meaningful step toward eliminating federal mandates as well as consolidating federal employment and training programs. More importantly, the bill makes government more effective in that it simplifies and consolidates duplicative and overlapping job training programs.

By streamlining federal workforce training programs, the SKILLS Act would reduce the administrative burden that current law places on the states. It also provides states with the needed flexibility to tailor job training programs, acknowledging that the needs of New Jersey are surely different than those of other states.

I am also pleased that the SKILLS Act preserves the 15% set-aside that states like New Jersey use to innovate and administer our re-employment programs. This flexibility allows us to use WIA funds at the state-level to pursue new ideas and react quickly to changing circumstances or disasters.
