## 1 SEC. 114. SUMMER FOOD SERVICE SUPPORT GRANTS.

2 Section 13(a) of the Richard B. Russell National
3 School Lunch Act (42 U.S.C. 1761(a)) is amended by add4 ing at the end the following:

5 "(13) SUMMER FOOD SERVICE SUPPORT
6 GRANTS.—

- "(A) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall 7 8 use funds made available to carry out this para-9 graph to award grants, on a competitive basis, 10 to State agencies to assist eligible service insti-11 tutions in participating in the program, includ-12 ing by providing such institutions with— 13 "(i) technical assistance; 14 "(ii) assistance with site improvement
- 15 costs;

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1	"(iii) assistance with transportation
2	costs; or
3	"(iv) support to carry out other inno-
4	vative activities that improve and encour-
5	age sponsor retention.
6	"(B) ELIGIBILITY.—To be eligible to re-
7	ceive a grant under this paragraph, a State
8	agency shall submit an application to the Sec-
9	retary in such manner, at such time, and con-
10	taining such information as the Secretary may
11	require.
12	"(C) Priority considerations.—In
13	making grants under this paragraph, the Sec-
14	retary shall—
15	"(i) give priority to State agencies—
16	"(I) with significant proportions
17	of children certified as eligible for free
18	and reduced price lunches under this

20	"(II) that demonstrate innovative

"(D) REPORT.—Not later than 3 fiscal 5 6 years after the first fiscal year for which funds 7 are appropriated under subparagraph (F), the 8 Secretary shall submit to the Committee on 9 Education and Labor of the House of Rep-10 resentatives and the Committee on Agriculture, 11 Nutrition, and Forestry of the Senate a report 12 that— 13 "(i) describes the activities carried out 14 with funds awarded under this paragraph; 15 "(ii) evaluates the impact of such ac-

16 tivities on the number of eligible service in17 stitutions, program sites, and meals served
18 under the program;

19 "(iii) describes any variables that may
20 impact the effectiveness of such activities,
21 such as geographic areas and population
22 density;

23 "(iv) identifies States and service in24 stitutions in which the funds were most ef25 fective in improving participation; and
